BRACING POSITIONS



ATTENTION

Si votre siège est situé dans une rangée à la hauteur d'une des issues de l'appareil et que vous ne lisez, parlez ni ne comprenez l'anglais, ou que vous ne comprenez pas les symboles graphiques, ou que vous ne comprenez pas les instructions orales de l'équipage en anglais, signalez-le au personnel de bord et demandez qu'une nouvelle place vous soit assignée.

Falls sich Ihr Sitzplatz in einer Ausgangsreihe befindet, und Sie die englische Sprache weder lesen, sprechen noch verstehen, oder die grafischen Symbole oder englischsprachige Anweisungen des Flugzeugpersonals nicht verstehen können, bitten wir Sie, das Kabinenpersonal um Zuweisung eines anderen Sitzplatzes zu ersuchen.

Se il vostro posto è situato accanto ad una uscita di emergenza e siete impossibilitati a leggere, parlare, o comprendere la lingua inglese come pure le immagini grafiche, o se non siete in grado di comprendere le istruzioni orali impartite in inglese dal personale di volo, chiedete la riassegnazione del posto ad un assistente di volo.

Si su asiento está en la fila de una de las salidas, y usted no lee, habla, ni entiende el idioma inglés, o si no entiende los símbolos gráficos ni las instrucciones orales en inglés de la tripulación, pida al personal de a bordo que se le asigne otro asiento.

If you are seated in an exit row seat, you may be called upon to assist in an emergency. Follow the directions of the crew. Read this card carefully. Emergency exits are heavy and may be difficult to manipulate. You must be willing and able to perform all the functions shown and described.

- Locate the emergency exit, recognize the emergency exit opening mechanism and comprehend the instructions for operating the emergency exit. Determine if opening the emergency exit is safe (smoke, fire, debris, etc.).
- Operate the emergency exit. Secure the emergency exit door so that it will not impede use of the exit.
- Follow oral directions and hand signals given by the crew.
- Activate the slide, pass quickly through the emergency exit, and stabilize the slide after deployment to help others in getting off the slide.
- Select and follow a safe path away from the emergency exit.

No passenger may be seated in an exit row seat if it is likely they are unable to perform one or more of the functions because:

- The person is less than 15 years of age or lacks the capacity to perform one or more of the applicable functions without the assistance of an adult companion, parent, or other relative.
- The person lacks sufficient mobility, strength, or dexterity in both arms and hands, and both legs to:
 - reach the emergency exits quickly
 - reach upward, sideways, and downward to the location of emergency exit and exit-slide operating mechanisms
 - grasp and push, pull, turn, or otherwise manipulate those mechanisms and open emergency exits
 - lift out, hold, deposit on nearby seats, or maneuver over the seatbacks to the next row objects the size and weight of over-wing window exit doors (25-55 lbs)
 - to remove obstructions similar in size and weight to over-wing doors
 - maintain balance while removing obstructions
 - move expeditiously through the exit
 - stabilize an escape slide and assist others in getting off
- The person cannot read, speak, and understand instructions provided related to emergency evacuation in the English language or graphic form
- The person cannot understand spoken crew commands and impart information verbally to other passengers in English
- The person cannot see well enough to perform one or more of the applicable functions without the assistance of visual aids beyond contact lenses or eyeglasses
- The person cannot hear well enough to hear and understand instructions shouted by crewmembers without assistance beyond a hearing aid
- The person has a condition or responsibilities, such as caring for small children, that might prevent them from performing one or more of the applicable functions
- The person has a condition that might cause them harm if they perform one or more of the applicable functions

Contact a flight attendant for reseating if:

- 1) You cannot meet the selection criteria
- 2) You have a nondiscernible condition that will prevent you from performing the applicable functions
- 3) You may suffer bodily harm as the result of performing one or more of the functions
- 4) You do not wish to perform the functions

It is not necessary to explain why you need reseating.

Please observe the fasten seat belt and the no smoking signs. On flights where smoking is permitted, please only smoke cigarettes while sitting in a passenger seat in a designated smoking zone.

Federal law prohibits tampering with, disabling, or destroying any smoke detector in an airplane lavatory.
